Main hosts	<i>Prunus</i> spp. The major hosts are fruit tree species, such as apricot, cherry, peach and plum.
Likelihood for establishment in UK	Based on pest risk analyses, establishment of <i>A. bungii</i> is considered likely, in the south of the UK, but may be limited in northern parts
