The European Union: 500 million people - 28 countries






Enlargement: from six to 28 countries

24 official languages











TRACES tracks the movements of animals, products of animal origin, food and feed, live plants and plant products imported from outside the EU or travelling through the EU







TRACES: Good to know

- Free access web-based system, 24/24h, 7/7d
- Animals, plants, food & feed
- Centralized in the EU for import / EU internal movement / export
- Multilingualism (23 EU official languages + KR, RU, ZH, TR, VI,...)
- Users from 78 countries public and private
- Confidentiality: the level of access depends on the status of the user
- Interoperability based on Customs Nomenclature






TRACES: Good to know

- Experience in certification :
 - > 10 years of data
 - > 1,2 millions certificates a year
 - > 1 million notifications (sent by email) a day
- Statistic tools: Data Warehouse and QlikView





Pilot on plants & Integration with plant health interception notifications



TRACES: TNT and phytosanitary certification

- 01/2016 Release of the first TNT module into production: "Imports of products of organic origin"
- End of 2016: Imports to EU, Phytosanitary certification
- End of 2017: Intra and Exports



TRACES: TNT and phytosanitary certification

- Compatibility with ISPM 12:
 - Format (XML, UN/CEFACT)
 - Harmonised terms
 - Exchange mechanism



TRACES: Towards e-Certification

- Legal aspect
 - > E-certification must be legally recognised by authorities
- Technical conditions
 - > Exchange of data between databases
 - e-signature for authentication non-repudiation
- European Union situation
 - E-Certification not legally accepted
 - All TRACES users will be granted access when e-cert accepted
 - > International agreements between the European Union and countries
 - e.g. NZ web service





TRACES: Towards e-Certification

- WEB service with New Zealand "E-cert"
 - > From January 2010
 - Tailored system then UN/CEFACT
 - > All border inspection posts (BIPs), Limited commodities (meat and fish)
 - Certificates created in E-cert and transformed in TRACES
 - > 2015 number of certificates: 14000
- NZ pilot project in 6 months: e-signature
- Further objectives:
 - ➤ US, CN, AU, TH, BR + UN/CEFACT
