


OCS background





Implementing OCS users workflow requirements











Implementing general user requirements

- Multitenant license (Codex and IPPC)
- Compatibility with mobile devices and main browsers
- Multilingual system
- Easy documents view
- User registration and management system (CCPs created and managed by Secretariat, internal review through CCPs)
- Possibility to configure (customize) the system
- Different user types, with one user having one or more roles



Implementing general user requirements (continued)

- Four types of comments will be allowed on each paragraph (editorial; substantive; technical; translation), in addition to general comments
- Availability of notifications with a user-friendly format
- Ability for users to search for users, documents and internal comments
- Ability to export data in the most common formats



Implementing IPPC Secretariat requirements

- The Secretariat will administer users (contact points), upload documents, freeze some paragraphs, invite for comments and compile received comments.
- A compiling tool shall be provided to handle the comments received and able to generate an output similar to the following scheme, available for download in Word:


