General Activities

Guided by:

- the draft national list of quarantine pests
- general awareness of pests of concern to the region and internationally
- Response to public reports of plant pest problems & identification of the pests, where necessary
- OUTPUT: database of reports & findings is generated and maintained

Current Activities 1

Mango Seed Weevil Annual Detection Survey

- Generally conducted during main mango season (May – September)
- 5 fruit per randomly selected tree from locations island-wide collected, examined & results noted
- Mangoes prohibited entry from ALL countries: mangoes confiscated at ports of entry are examined for the pest & destroyed





Current Activities 2

FruitFly Detection/Monitoring Survey

- Resumed in early 2015
- Lures, traps & accessories provided annually by USDA
- Staff trained through USDA & database being refined for use in the regional fruitfly program under aegis of the CPHD Forum





Ongoing Activities

Giant African Snail Delimiting & monitoring Survey

- First reported in 2008
- Activities to date include collection & destruction of snails & baiting on an ad hoc basis
- Formal snail eradication program being developed for execution from January 2016
- Eradication estimated to be attained in 7-8 years

- 1. Red Palm Weevil (detection)
- 2. Budrot of Palms (monitoring)
- 3. Lethal Yellowing Disease of Plants (monitoring)
- 4. Fusarium oxysporum race
 4 (Panama disease)
 (detection)
- Citrus Greening Disease (Huanglongbing) (monitoring)
- 6. Agave Weevil (monitoring)
