




Specific Trade Concerns (1995-2011) 325 Total






Trade Concerns by Subject (1995-2010)

Types of Trade Concerns

- India's restrictions on poultry due to avian influenza
- EU Novel Foods regulation
- Japan's MRLs for pesticides / additives + testing regime
- US Food Safety Modernization Act
- EU MRLs for pesticides
- EU prohibition on certain plastic kitchenware from China, Hong Kong, China
 - Chinese Taipei's prohibition of ractopamine
