

Why Transparency?

- Enhanced clarity, predictability
- Affects market access





Transparency elements

Obligations

- Notification of draft SPS regulations
- Designation of notification authority
- Publication of SPS regulations
- Establishment of enquiry point

Taking advantage of notifications

Notification of draft SPS regulations: What to notify?

New or modified regulation



Significant impact on trade (restricting or facilitating)



Notification of draft SPS regulations: When to notify and in which format?



Notification of draft SPS regulations: When to notify and in which format?

- Addendum provides additional information or changes to an original notification
- Corrigendum corrects error in original notification
- · Revision replaces an existing notification



Notification of draft SPS regulations: New recommendations

G/SPS/7/Rev.3 - operational as of 1 December 2008

- Notify measures based on international standards
- Default choice 60 day comment period
- Identify date of publication
- Date of entry into force 6 months after date of publication



What else to notify?

Recognition of equivalence:

measure recognized, products covered (G/SPS/7/Rev.3 - specific format)

 Special and differential treatment: difficulties with notified measure

(G/SPS/33/Rev.1 - specific format, under review)

· Regionalization:

request and/or determination (G/SPS/48 - no specific format)



Who notifies?

National Notification Authority

<u>Single</u> central government authority responsible for the implementation of notification procedures e.g., agency responsible for food safety, animal and plant health

Only one NNA



Publication of regulations

Publish what? SPS regulations When? Promptly allow a reasonable interval (6 months) before entry into force (except in urgent circumstances



Transparency timeline





Enquiry Point

Provides answers and documentation to all reasonable questions from interested Members

- Can be same as NNA
- Can have more than one but clearly define responsibilities



All reasonable questions?

Regarding...

- SPS regulations, draft or adopted
- Inspection procedures, etc.
- Risk assessment
- Membership in international organizations or international agreements
- Text of these agreements



Using the Enquiry Point: Beyond Obligations

- Collect/disseminate SPS information
 - SPS documents
 - SPS notifications received that could affect exports
- Inform other government agencies, private sector
- Coordinate comments on other countries' notifications



Making it work


- Resources need not be extensive





Notifications circulated (2000 – 05/2011) Total: 11,247










Since December 2008 Regular Notifications



SPS Information Management System (SPS IMS)

Why SPS IMS?

- Since 1995
 - > 10,000 SPS notifications
 - > 2,000 other SPS documents
 - > 300 specific trade concerns (STCs)
 - Enquiry Point/Notification Authority info changing frequently



Why SPS IMS?

- Tool for tracking WTO/SPS info

- Significant efficiency gains

- Enhanced analytical capabilities

- Better service for Members



What data is in the SPS IMS?

Content of SPS notifications

Basic info on all SPS-related documents

Details of all STCs

Contact information on EPs/NNAs



How does it help Members?

- to generate with one click:
 - Monthly/Weekly/Daily Summary of Notifications
 - Latest list of Enquiry Points/Notification Authorities
 - Transparency overview
 - Membership in WTO and ISSBs "Predefined reports"



How does it help Members?

- to undertake searches / prepare reports according to specific needs:
 - Product- or region-specific searches on notifications
 - Theme-specific searches on Committee documents, e.g. on regionalization
 - Queries on specific trade concerns related to specific Members or products
 - Possible to export all results to Excel



Sanitary and phytosanitary measures

Problem: How do you ensure that your country's consumers are being supplied with food that is safe to eat — "safe" by the standards you consider appropriate? And at the same time, how can you ensure that strict health and safety regulations are not being used as an excuse for protecting domestic producers?

An agreement on how governments can apply food safety and animal and plant health measures (sanitary and phytosanitary or SPS measures) sets out the basic rules in the WTO.

> SPS Information Management System: a database of WTO information on SPS

(Notifications, concerns raised, other documents, enquiry points, etc)






Tips for searching

- To search in a free text field for the term ISPM 15 (but not ISPM), enter "ISPM 15"
- To see specific fields in search results, use custom reporting
- To sort a column in search results in ascending or descending order, click on the column title
- If you select more than one search criteria, records meeting all criteria ONLY will be shown (AND function)









