### History – pre 2004

- FAO Funding (principal) source (IPPC Secretariat, CPPC and APPPC)
- Technical assistance through TCPs
- Funding through Special projects
  - Netherlands support for participation (1998)
  - FAO special project for PCE (2002)
  - Special IPPC Multi-donor trust fund proposed (2003)





### 2004 – Present (11 years)

- IPPC Multi-donor trust fund established (2004)
  - USD 4 million contributed by 9 CPs
- Sustained extra-budgetary funding
  - EU / USD 4 million for participation of developing countries (2004 – 2015)
  - EU / USD 2.4 million for IRSS (2011,2012,2014)
- Resource Mobilization Strategy adopted (2012)
- Financial committee established (2012)

  - IPPC recognized as a Biodiversity-related Convention





### What the IPPC Secretariat is doing


- The Secretariat has established a Resource Mobilization Task Force (RMTF)
- Active outreach to contracting parties and donors
  - Contact with a number of contracting parties as a fundraising effort
  - Specific missions to priority countries and donors
- The Secretariat is working on partnering with organizations to jointly seek resources where possible





## Budget outlook – Regular programme

• FAO regular programme allotment to IPPC has been steady for the last 3 years and will remain the same for 2016/2017 biennium








### **Budget outlook**

- Financial management
  - an adequate administrative financial network
  - Strengthening financial instruments and practises
- Resource mobilization
  - Intensification of the in-kind contribution system
  - Institutionalizing the sponsorship of meetings
  - Technical improvements, donor relations and incentive programs

- Enabling environment
  - Revising the Convention itself
  - Develop information and communication strategies
  - Partnerships for Capacity Development
