Population

• Population (2007): 20.366.795



 Mozambique has a per capita income of US\$230 per year in 2006 that is amongst the ten lowest in the world.



 Agriculture is a key sector for economic growth and give work to more than 70 percent of the workforce, being the main activity for 95 percent of the people living in rural areas.



 Agricultural products contribute roughly to 20% of total exports



 Main agricultural exports include products like Banana, cotton, sugar, tobacco, copra cake, cashew nut, oilseeds (sunflower, sesame, soyabean), spices and wood



 The main external markets being the Portugal, Belgium, Spain, UK, India, Pakistan; Switzerland, Japan, South Africa and Zimbabwe);



 Phytosanitary Inspection Points are concentrated in the Maputo airport, in the main ports of Maputo, Beira and Nacala and in a limited number of entry points along the borders with neighboring countries



 The body responsible for plant health protection in Mozambique is the Departamento de Sanidade Vegetal based in the Ministry of Agriculture, which is responsible for the Inspection and issuing of import permits and phytosanitary certificates for export



Major constraints may be summarized as:

- inadequate capacity to monitor spreading of pests and disease,
- carry out pest risk analysis
- conduct effective inspection to avoid entry of quarantine pests,
- conduct credible and reliable export certification and
- absence of essential facilities to support the regulatory function
