

The content of a pest report

The <u>International Standard for Phytosanitary Measures No 17: Pest reporting</u> offers comprehensive advice on the content of a pest report. It states that a pest report should clearly indicate:

- the identity of the pest with scientific name (where possible, to the species level, and below species level, if known and relevant);
- the date of the report;
- host(s) or articles concerned (as appropriate);
- the status of the pest under the <u>International Standard for Phytosanitary</u> Measures No 8: Determination of pest status in an area;
- geographical distribution of the pest (including a map, if appropriate);
- the nature of the immediate or potential danger, or other reason for reporting.

The report may also indicate the phytosanitary measures applied or required, their purpose, and any other information as indicated for pest records in ISPM 8. If all the information is not available on the pest situation then a preliminary report should be made and updates made, as further information becomes available.


Updating an existing pest report on the IPP (Part II)

You can find Part I in October issue of NROs UPDATE.

When updating the existing pest reports users often would like to replace the file previously attached to the report. In order to do it you need to follow these steps:

- Log in to the IPP website and click on the button labelled "Edit Country Information".
- 2. Underneath the title "National Reporting Obligations" there is a list of reports, including pest reports (Pest Reports), which can be submitted by countries.
- 3. To see the list of all pest reports submitted by your country you need to click on the "Pest Reports".
- 4. From the list of all pest reports submitted by your country you need to select the report you would like to update by clicking on "Edit" on the right. Clicking on this button activates a form. This form opens enabling you to update data submitted before in that report.
- 5. Scroll down to see "Files". To replace the previously uploaded file (shown after "Currently:"), click on the button "Choose file" below it and then select a document stored on your computer (remember to click on Open in a dialogue box which should appear on your screen).
- 6. In a field "Description" seen above the file, you can change a name of the file by typing its new name. In this field you can type any generic name, like: Attachment or Report or any specific longer name of your choice. That name would be then visible as a highlighted link (Under: "Report Files") on which you can click to download the file.
- 7. Click on the button labelled: **"Update Report"** at the bottom of the page.




Did you know?
