The first session of the <u>Commission on Phytosanitary</u> <u>Measures</u> (CPM-1 (2006)) established the Standards Committee (SC) which consists of 25 members from the seven FAO regions.

The SC is responsible for:

- overseeing the <u>IPPC Standard Setting Process</u>
- managing the development of <u>International Standards</u> for Phytosanitary Measures (ISPMs)
- providing guidance and oversight to the work of <u>Technical Panels (TPs)</u> and <u>Expert Working Groups</u> (EWGs)


