Relevance of environmental protection for IPPC

CPM Recommendations on environmental issues:

- R-01: LMOs, biosecurity and alien invasive species
- R-02: <u>Threats to biodiversity posed by alien species: actions within the</u> framework of the IPPC
- R-03: Replacement or reduction of the use of methyl bromide as a phytosanitary measure
- R-04: <u>IPPC coverage of aquatic plants</u>

Biodiversity Liaison Group (BLG) member since August 2014 (9th BLG meeting)






CPM recommendation R02 on Alien Species

CPM (2005) adopted the recommendation on Threats to biodiversity posed by alien species: actions within the framework of the IPPC.

<u>Addressed to</u>: CPs, NPPOs and Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD).

<u>Scope</u>: Invasive Alien Species (IAS), including plants that are IAS.








CPM recommendation R02 on Alien Species

Recommending:

- NPPOs to enhance plant protection laws and policies to include the protection of wild flora and biodiversity from pests (including plants that are IAS);
- enhance exchanges and improve cooperation between IPPC and CBD CPs;
- establish or adapt existing pest alert systems to include plants that are IAS;
- address these concerns in standard setting and implementation at different levels.

SPG (2015) introduced the concept of IPPC annual themes and agreed that their primary purpose is to focus the advocacy efforts of the IPPC.

CPM-11 (2016) agreed that the themes for the years leading to the IYPH would be:

- 2016 Plant Health and Food Security
- 2017 Plant Health and Trade Facilitation
- 2018 Plant Health and Environmental Protection
- 2019 Plant Health and Capacity Development

Purpose: highlight the important role of Plant Health towards Environmental Protection, e.g. the decline of natural ecosystems as a result of pest introduction and spread, and positive impact of ISPMs towards protecting the environment.


