1. Major Achievements for 2018

- <u>2018</u> is remarkable for the IPPC by disseminating IPPC annual theme "Plant Health and Environmental Protection", and by getting IPPC initiative on IYPH in 2020 endorsed at the 73rd Session of UN General Assembly
- <u>10 major achievements</u> for 2018 are highlighted as follows:





Major Achievements #01: Supported IPPC governing activities

- Organized CPM-13, five Bureau, three FC and one SPG meetings, as well as two SC and two IC meetings
- <u>Supported</u> establishments of a Focus Group on Commodity and Pathway Standards (FGCPS), and a Task Force for Topics (TFT)
- Improved IPPC Strategic Framework for 2020-2030 through collecting comments from all NPPOs, RPPOs and over 20 organizations









Major Achievements #02: Strengthened standards setting

- <u>Adopted</u> 10 international standards including 4 ISPMs, 5 DPs, and one PT
- <u>Progressed</u> 22 international standards + one CPM recommendation
- <u>Added</u> 37 new topics to the work programme for developing new DPs and PTs





Major Achievements #03: Strengthened standards implementation

- <u>Conducted</u> PCE in three countries (Barbados, Lebanon, and Tunisia)
- <u>Implemented</u> six IPPC projects with USD 1.7 millions
- Organized seven IPPC regional workshops and one NRO workshop with > 220 participants from > 140 CPs

Major Achievements #04: Advanced IPPC ePhyto solutions

- <u>IPPC Hub</u> was opened for business with 26 countries registered for exchanging ePhytos
- IPPC GeNs were finalized for piloting
- The 3rd IPPC Global Symposium on <u>ePhyto</u> was organized in in Malaysia with 83 participants from 36 countries and 20 international or regional organizations

Major Achievements #05: **Promoted proclamation of IYPH**

- <u>Supported</u> the endorsement of 2020 as IYPH by the 73rd Session of UNGA, with one reception for IYPH promotion organized at UN-HQs in New York
- <u>Approved</u> the skeleton of IYPH programme events and their associated estimated costs at the CPM-13
- <u>Organized</u> the 4th IYPH Steering Committee meeting







Major Achievements #06: Disseminated 2018 IPPC annual theme


- Organized a series of activities to showcase the IPPC annual theme "Plant health and environmental protection" during the CPM 13, including one keynote address, one special session, and one side event
- <u>Held</u> one IPPC Seminar on Plant health, Climate change and Environment during the SPG





Major Achievements #07: Promoted communication & advocacy

- <u>Initialized</u> migration of IPP under FAO.org, bringing up a new design with a more functional structure, renewed contents, and better usability and accessibility
- <u>Increased</u> IPPC's visibility by releasing 105 items of IPPC news and 34 video interviews, as well as by 30% of increase in use of social media
- <u>Published</u> 20 IPPC publications (manuals, factsheets, and broaches)







Major Achievements #08: Promoted International cooperation

- *Established* partnership with 37 international and regional organizations
- <u>Worked</u> with STDF for Beyond compliance project, with EU for implementation of the 3rd cycle IRSS and renewal of current implementation project, as well as with CBD for implementing the JWP (2017-2018)
- <u>Signed</u> cooperation agreement between the IPPC and WCO, with development of the JWP (2019-2021) in process

 Regional, and 2 international)


