	The training was organised by learning objectives with materials associated with each, which succeeded because we did not assume a common knowledge. The camaraderie of the Beyond Compliance facilitators in training was high and was supported by their experience of the pre-training calls. Challenges for training and to some degree cases include the range of languages and some weakness in English, which was the stated language for carrying out the work. This can be addressed in part when we are through validation and have Facilitators with different language proficiencies.
