1. Opening of the Meeting

- [1] Mr Jingyuan XIA, IPPC Secretary, made opening remarks and expressed his deep gratitude to Stephen BUTCHER and Greg WOLF for their active work on the Item 6 of Bureau agenda. Mr Francisco Javier TRUJILLO ARRIAGA, CPM Chairperson, welcomed participants to the second virtual meeting of the CPM Bureau. Mr Gameel Anwar Mohammed RAMADHAN sent his regrets, clarifying that he did not have a stable internet connection to be able to fully participate in the meeting. Mr John GREIFER (alternate for North America) was recognized as an observer to the meeting.

2. Meeting Arrangements

2.1. Documents list

- [2] The Documents list was introduced and it is attached to the Report as [Annex 1](#).

2.2. Participants list

3. Agenda

- [4] The CPM Bureau adopted the agenda with the inclusion of an item under Any Other Business to discuss how the IPPC communication takes place. The Agenda is attached to this Report as [Annex 3](#).

4. Review of CPM Bureau Action List

- [5] The IPPC Secretariat informed the CPM Bureau that all actions from the Action list of the previous CPM Bureau meeting were acted upon and resolved.

- [6] The CPM Bureau:

(1) *Noted* the update.

5. Report from the IPPC Secretariat

- [7] Mr Jingyuan XIA updated the CPM Bureau on the progress on how to face and help overcome the COVID-19 pandemic.

- [8] He informed the CPM Bureau that a subpage on the International Phytosanitary Portal (IPP) had been created with all the COVID-19 related information issued. He informed that the IPPC Secretariat has been engaging with the FAO Deputy Director-General for Programme (DDG-P) and IYPH ISC Chairperson to discuss the issue of extension of the IYPH beyond 2020, reporting on efforts to get FAO support to reschedule and extend IYPH events into the first half of 2021 to make up for the lost opportunities this year. Mr XIA mentioned the ongoing work on ePhyto, which is being promoted via tele-training during the COVID-19 pandemic.

- [9] The CPM Bureau:

(2) *Noted* the report.

6. The Bureau's Roles and Scope of its Work during the COVID-19 Crisis

- [10] Mr Stephen BUTCHER (South West Pacific Region) introduced the paper on the CPM Bureau role and scope of its work, clarifying that the current rules of procedure have never taken into consideration the possibility that the CPM would not take place. He underlined that the role and purpose of the Bureau are to support the CPM work and to provide guidance to the IPPC Secretariat. He stressed that it is of the utmost importance that the CPM Bureau maintains the said role and purpose during this unprecedented situation.
- [11] He further pointed out that the CPM Bureau should continue taking decisions on operational matters through virtual means, consulting with Contracting Parties (CPs) on some more substantial issues that cannot be delayed further and delaying some decisions, such as adopting ISPMs, to the next CPM. Mr BUTCHER noted that the current proposal indicates that the IPPC Secretariat work plan and budget provide the necessary elements to continue working until the next CPM session can be convened. Other CPM Bureau members agreed with this interpretation and agreed that CPs should be consulted on this approach by circulating the agenda CPM-15 agenda items that Bureau will discuss and allowing CPs a set time to respond to the proposal.
- [12] The Legal Office of FAO (FAOLEG) informed the CPM Bureau that the issue of making decisions through virtual means during the COVID-19 outbreak has been taken into consideration and brought to the attention of FAO. She clarified that the query addressed to the FAO Director-General (DG) aims to clarify how the Governing and Statutory Bodies of the Organization can continue working under unprecedented circumstances, considering the lack of specific provisions in the Rules of Procedures¹.
- [13] She proposed the CPM Bureau to circulate amongst IPPC CPs a list of decisions that the CPM Bureau should take on behalf of the CPM during its absence, as a similar approach is likely to be adopted for other FAO governing bodies. FAOLEG clarified that the CPM Bureau may consider establishing a seventy-two-hour limit for CPs to express their position on each decision the CPM Bureau can take on behalf of CPM but warned CPM Bureau members that a negative opinion by a single CP may cause further delays and hinder the entire process.
- [14] The CPM Bureau agreed to the Chairperson's proposal to draft a letter to CPs to explain the proposed criteria they would use to determine which decisions could be made by the CPM Bureau and which would need to be delayed along with the list of proposed agenda points and what action would be taken for each point.

[15] The CPM Bureau:

- (3) *Noted* the paper.
- (4) *Agreed* to draft an official communication from the CPM Chairperson to all Contracting Parties on the proposed course of action that the CPM Bureau would take to help ensure the continuity of work during the COVID-19 pandemic.

7. Analysis of Decision Points Arising from CPM-15 Agenda

[16] The IPPC Secretariat introduced the discussion², mentioning that the CPM suggested decisions have been grouped into four categories for selecting which ones could be dealt with by the CPM Bureau.

[17] One CPM Bureau Member discuss the fact that sharing the current paper without a detailed explanation may generate additional confusion amongst the CPs. The CPM Chairperson suggested that the document may be revised in light of the discussion from the previous agenda item and included int the letter he will address to CPs.

[18] The CPM Bureau agreed to provide recommendations on how to present the information in the current paper to CPs within two weeks, with the purpose of providing better information to move this discussion forward during the next CPM Bureau meeting.

[19] The CPM Bureau:

- (5) *Noted* the paper.
- (6) *Agreed* to make recommendations on CPM decision points on Governance papers within two weeks.

8. Extension of IYPH 2020

[20] The IPPC Secretariat presented the proposal to extend IYPH 2020 due to the several postponements and cancellation of its events and activities due to the COVID-19 outbreak. He mentioned that three major activities that could be likely prolonged to 2021:

- CPM-15 with its Ministerial segment was postponed (April 2020) and consideration will be given to hold this in 2021;
- International Plant Health Conference to be postponed to May/June 2021, including IYPH closing ceremony; and
- Some key IYPH Communication activities to be extended to the first Semester of 2021.

[21] The IPPC Secretariat also reported that letters from the IYPH ISC Chairperson, Mr Ralf LOPIAN, and a group of fourteen scientists have been addressed to FAO -DDG Ms Beth BECHDOL in support to the

extension of the IYPH 2020, as well as suggestions to reschedule IYPH activities into 2021, while asking FAO PSP on how to extend the current partnerships beyond the end of 2020.

[22] The CPM Bureau welcomed the reported initiatives aiming to the extension – either formal or informal – of IYPH initiatives and activities into 2021, noting that the International Year of Fruits and Vegetables 2021 is highly compatible with the IYPH objectives.

[23] The CPM Bureau:

(7) *Noted* the update and the activities duly carried out by the IYPH Secretariat to prolong IYPH and/or reschedule IYPH activities into 2021.

(8) *Expressed* support for the efforts by the IPPC Secretariat towards organising IYPH events through the remainder of the year and during 2021.

9. Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework

[24] The IPPC Secretariat reported³ on the coming steps within the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) and informed CPM Bureau Members regarding the participation of the IPPC community to this process. He underlined the opportunity to contribute substantially to the GBF targets relating to the shared mandate of the CBD and the IPPC on “invasive alien species”, for example by setting realistic targets on the development of action plans and metrics associated with managing and preventing their spread.

[25] He underlined that at least national plant protection organizations (NPPO) should voice the IPPC community’s position to their national CBD contact points as the GBF is a country-driven process.

[26] The CPM Bureau welcomed the opportunity and suggested to draft a message linking the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework with the IPPC Strategic Framework 2020 – 2030, to circulate within each region.

[27] The CPM Bureau:

(9) *Asked* the IPPC Secretariat to draft a document on the commenting process and IPPC community views on post-2020 GBF that could be shared with IPPC contact points as well as talking notes to be used to facilitate discussions between national CBD and IPPC contact points.

10. Any Other Business

CPM Bureau selection and appointment of IC membership

[28] The IPPC Secretariat briefly reviewed the process leading to the CPM Bureau e-Decision regarding the selection and appointment of IC members.

[29] The CPM Bureau:

- (10) *Selected* and *appointed* seven IC regional representatives, five IC experts and four alternative and replacement members as presented in [Appendix 5](#) to this report.

How IPPC Communications take place

[30] One CPM Bureau Member asked for feedback on IPPC news, especially the CPM Bureau – IPPC Secretariat joint message on COVID-19. He also inquired whether it is possible to reach out to all CPs with news through emails. The IPPC Secretariat clarified that there is an e-mail utility which is normally used to push a news item to all IPP contacts and will check if the joint message has been shared through this utility as well.

11. Next Meeting

[31] The IPPC Secretariat raised an issue that a meeting of the Finance Committee (FC) is to be held prior to the next CPM Bureau. There is no discussion and decision-making due to time limitation.

[32] The CPM Bureau agreed to hold a monthly virtual meeting and scheduled the next meeting for Thursday 4 June from 12:00 to 14:00 (CEST).

[33] The IPPC Secretariat informed the CPM Bureau that FAO DDG-P (Ms Bech BECHDOL) will be requested to deliver opening remarks at the next CPM Bureau meeting.

12. Closing of the Meeting

The Chairperson thanked all participants and closed the meeting.
