• All countries have the capacity to implement harmonized measures to reduce pest spread and minimize the impact of pests on food security, trade, economic growth, and the environment








Figure 1. The four stages of the IPPC Standard setting procedure (SSP).






Stage 1: Developing the *List of Topics (LOT)* for IPPC Standards



Step 1: Call for Topics



Next call for topics for standards and implementation: 2021 (tentative April)

- draft outline
- literature review
- justification
- support by others

- Framework for Standards and Implementation
- Criteria
- Recommend priorities for proposed topics




Figure 3. Procedure for stage 1, step 2: Annual review of the List of topics for IPPC standards.





Step 3: Development of draft specification

- Assigns a lead and assistant steward
- Reviews and approves the draft specification for 60-day consultation
- Submit comments on the draft specification
- Reviews comments and provides recommendations to the SC based on the comments
- Revises and approves the specification




Figure 5. Procedure for stage 2, step 4: A) preparation of draft ISPM or PT; B) preparation of draft DP.

SC-7

Submit comments during the first consultation (lasts 90 days, 1 July to 30 September) Reviews and prepares responses to the comments, and revises the draft ISPM

Revises the draft ISPM and approves for second consultation




Figure 6. Procedure for stage 3, step 5: First consultation. A) process followed for draft ISPMs, B) process followed by draft DPs and PTs (to note that while DPs are normally not sent for second consultation, PTs are after approval by SC).

 Reviews and prepares responses to the comments, and revises the draft ISPM

SC

- Reviews the comments, steward's responses to the comments, and the revised draft ISPM
- Revises the draft ISPM and recommends to the CPM
- Provides a summary of major issues discussed as part of the SC meeting report






Figure 8. Procedure for stage 4, step 7: Adoption of A) ISPMs other than DPs, B) DPs.




Figure 9. Procedure for stage 4, step 9: Publication and Language review.
