## **BUREAU OF THE COMMISSION ON PHYTOSANITARY MEASURES (TELECONFERENCE)**

**ROME, ITALY  
10 JUNE 2021**

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## 1. Opening of the Meeting

- [1] Mr Lucien KONAN KOUAME, Chairperson of the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (CPM), opened the meeting and welcomed all participants. Mr Avetik NERSISYAN, IPPC Officer-in-Charge for daily matters, updated the CPM Bureau regarding the ongoing vaccination process in FAO and also that Mr Mirko MONTUORI will be working for the Plant Production and Protection Division (NSP), thus leaving the IPPC Secretariat. He invited the CPM Bureau members to provide their inputs on some emerging issues and also to initiate the discussion on the next session of the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures.
- [2] Mr KONAN KOUAME expressed the gratitude and appreciation for Mr MONTUORI's work, dedication and contribution to the IPPC community and wished him success on his future position on behalf of the CPM Bureau.

[8] The IPPC Secretariat shared the received nominations with CPM Bureau members, specifying that some regions have not yet submitted any nominations while other regions submitted more than one nomination.

[9] The CPM Bureau discussed and endorsed some of the received nominations for the CPM Focus Group on CPM Focus Group on Implementation of the IPPC Strategic Framework 2020–2030 Development Agenda Items, noting that the nominees from Regional Plant Protection Organizations, Latin America and The Caribbean, Near East and North Africa are still pending. The CPM Bureau noted the need for additional time to review the received nominations from the remaining two CPM Focus Groups and asked the IPPC Secretariat to draft a summary of the nominations received to be discussed at an extraordinary meeting on 17 June, 12:00 – 14:00 (CEST), specifying that nominations of IPPC

- (2) *Agreed* that nominations of representatives of IPPC governing or subsidiary bodies may be accepted without a curriculum vitae and statement of commitment.
- (3) *Agreed* to hold an extraordinary session of the CPM Bureau on 17 June at 12:00 – 14:00 CEST to review the received nominations for the CPM Focus Groups on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues and Communications.
- (4) *Asked* the IPPC Secretariat to draft an outline summarising the received nominations for the CPM Focus Groups on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues, and Communications.

## 5. Financial Updates<sup>4</sup>

- [11] The IPPC Secretariat presented the CPM decisions with financial implications and introduced an outline for next year's allocation of the IPPC Secretariat budget, inviting the CPM Bureau members to provide suggestions for additional activities in 2022.
- [12] Mr John GREIFER, Chairperson of the Financial Committee (FC), clarified that the budget allocation process consists in a series of consultations and that the concrete budget allocations will be defined at the FC meeting in October, after the meeting of the Strategic Planning Group (SPG).
- [13] The IPPC Secretariat asked the CPM Bureau for guidance on the next CPM session, particularly on the possibility to hold it in presence. The CPM Bureau suggested to begin preparations for the sixteenth CPM session in presence, with the understanding that any modification to this decision shall be communicated to the IPPC Secretariat no later than November 2021.
- [14] The CPM Bureau:
- (5) *Noted* the financial outline.
  - (6) *Asked* the IPPC Secretariat to begin preparations work plan and budget with view that the sixteenth session of the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures will be held in presence.

## 6. Review of requests for commenting period for draft CPM Recommendations

- [15] The IPPC Secretariat summarised the request<sup>5</sup>, specifying that stakeholders from the private sector had been granted access to the Online Comment System and asked the CPM Bureau to grant industry representatives permission to provide their comments on draft CPM Recommendation on Facilitating safe trade by reducing the incidence of contaminating pests associated with traded goods (2019-002) during 2021 consultation period.
- [16] The CPM Bureau renewed<sup>6</sup> its position that private sector representatives should present their comments through their respective National Plant Protection Organizations (NPPOs), in accordance with the Convention, but agreed to create one account for an industry representative who will submit comments on behalf of all the concerned industries during the 2021 consultation period.
- [17] The CPM Bureau
- (7) *Encouraged* the private sector representatives to present their comments through their respective National Plant Protection Organizations (NPPOs) or RPPOs, in accordance with the Convention.
  - (8) *Agreed* to grant industry representatives permission to provide their comments on draft CPM Recommendation on Facilitating safe trade by reducing the incidence of contaminating pests associated with traded goods (2019-002) during 2021 consultation period.

- (9) *Asked* the IPPC Secretariat to create one account for an industry representative who will submit comments on behalf of all the concerned industries during the 2021 consultation period.

## **7. CIG Joint Statement on Invasive Pest Transfer**

- [18] The IPPC Secretariat outlined the key points of the letter the Cargo Integrity Group (CIG) addressed to the IPPC community. The CPM Bureau thanked the CIG for its message and encouraged its members to share the joint statement with the Sea Container Task Force (SCTF) for consideration and further discussion, noting that the CIG is also an SCTF member.

## **8. TORs of Consultant for work on Diagnostic Laboratory Networks**

- [19] The IPPC Secretariat shared the updated Terms of Reference (ToRs) with the CPM Bureau, adjusted to reflect the reduction in budget allocation for this task, and specified that the preliminary diagnostic laboratory mapping will aim to identify which laboratory typologies exist and may be of interest for the IPPC community.
- [20] The CPM Bureau noted the updated ToRs and agreed to share them with relevant colleagues to obtain specific feedback by the next CPM Bureau ordinary meeting.

- (10) *Noted* the updated Terms of Reference and *agreed* to share them with relevant colleagues to obtain specific feedback by the next CPM Bureau ordinary meeting.

## **9. Update on Banana fusarium wilt TR4**

- [21] The IPPC Secretariat reported that the work on this matter is ongoing and that there are some budget implications emerging from this activity. The CPM Bureau asked the IPPC Secretariat to draft an outline of the foreseen activities and related costs by the next CPM Bureau ordinary meeting.

- [22] The CPM Bureau:

- (11) *Asked* the IPPC Secretariat to draft an outline of the foreseen activities and related costs on the banana fusarium wilt TR4 by the next CPM Bureau ordinary meeting.

## **10. Any Other Business**

- *Update on the selection process of the IPPC Secretary:*

- [23] Mr KONAN KOUAME updated the CPM Bureau regarding the ongoing selection process for the new IPPC Secretary, reporting that ten candidates were interviewed after the written test. He mentioned that the interviewing panel assessed the candidates and sent the outcomes to FAO HR, which is going to shortlist three candidates, which will be then interviewed for final selection. The panel will include the CPM Chairperson.

- *Discussion on the dispute settlement function of the IPPC:*

- [24] The IPPC Secretariat recalled the CPM Bureau decision to suspend the activities related to the IPPC dispute settlement mechanism until the end of the International Year of Plant Health, which is coming to an end on 1 July 2021. The IPPC Secretariat specified that the first task to reinstate the work on this is to analyse the current discrepancies that emerged from several documents developed on this topic

over the years, with the support of a consultant with a background on international trade, allocating 20 000 USD from the IPPC Secretariat budget.

[25] The CPM Bureau noted that the dispute settlement is one of the functions allocated to the CPM by the Convention and agreed to reinitiate its work on this.

[26] The CPM Bureau:

- (12) *Agreed* to resume the work on dispute settlement and correct the current discrepancies.
- (13) *Asked* the IPPC Secretariat to allocate 20 000 USD to hire a consultant with a background on international trade law to analyse and propose potential corrections to the current discrepancies in the IPPC dispute settlement mechanism.

## **11. Next Meeting and Schedule of CPM Bureau Meetings for Second Semester of 2021**

[27] The next ordinary meeting of the CPM Bureau is scheduled for 8 July 2021, 12:00 – 14:00 (CEST) while the next extraordinary meeting of the CPM Bureau is scheduled for 17 June 2021, 12:00 – 14:00 CEST to review the submitted nominations for the two CPM Focus Groups on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues and Communications.

[28] The CPM Bureau members responded to the poll for scheduling next CPM Bureau, with the following results:

- 8 July;
- 26 August;
- 16 September;
- 14 October;
- 18 November; and
- 16 December.

The CPM Bureau agreed to the proposed schedule but clarified that each date shall be confirmed at the previous meeting. Updated information will be also reflected in the IPP calendar<sup>7</sup>.

## **12. Closing of the Meeting**

The CPM Chairperson thanked all participants and closed the meeting.
