1. Opening of the Meeting

- [1] Mr Lucien KONAN KOUAME, Chairperson of the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (CPM), opened the meeting and welcomed all participants, noting the presence of Ms Gabrielle VIVIAN-SMITH (New Zealand) as observer to the meeting. Mr Arop DENG, IPPC Secretary Officer-in-Charge, reported that the IPPC Secretariat had a successful Mid-Year meeting on the work plan and an open discussion on the outcomes of the survey to improve the IPPC Secretariat, resulting in an agreed set of recommendations to share with the new IPPC Secretary, once appointed.

4. Update on CPM Focus Groups (FGs)

4.1. Outcome of eDecision on CPM FG on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues

- [5] The CPM Bureau¹ held an eDecision to endorse three of the four standing nominations for the CPM Focus Group on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues. The standing nominations were the following:

- **Australia:** Mr Christopher DALE
- **Canada:** Ms Karen CASTRO
- **Egypt:** Ms Shaimaa IBRAHIM
- **Zimbabwe:** Mr Godfrey Pasurayi CHIKWENHERE
- The eDecision was open on Monday 21 until Wednesday 23 June 2021.

[7] The CPM Bureau:

- (1) *Noted* the outcome of the eDecision.
- (2) *Endorsed* the nominations of Mr Christopher DALE (Australia), Ms Karen CASTRO (Canada) and Mr Mr Godfrey Pasurayi CHIKWENHERE (Zimbabwe) for the CPM Focus Group on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues.

4.2. Composition and first meetings of the CPM Focus Groups

[8] The IPPC Secretariat followed up with CPM Bureau members and TC-RPPOs' Chairperson to ensure the endorsement of the latest nominations as agreed by the CPM Bureau on 10 and 17 June². The CPM Bureau member from Latin America and Caribbean, Mr Francisco Javier TRUJILLO ARRIAGA, had not received responses from his region during a first round of consultation and therefore urged the CPM Bureau and IPPC Secretariat to allow the CPM Focus Groups on the Implementation of the IPPC Strategic Framework 2020 – 2030 Development Agenda Items; on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Measures; and on Communications to start their work with the currently approved membership. Mr TRUJILLO ARRIAGA notified the CPM Bureau that Mr Pablo CORTESE, from the NPPO of Argentina, was nominated to participate to the work of the CPM Focus Group on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues.

[9] The TC-RPPOs' Chairperson, Mr Visoni TIMOTE, consulted with RPPO representatives and communicated the following nominations:

- Mr Nico HORN, EPPO Director, for the CPM Focus Group on the Implementation of the IPPC Strategic Framework 2020 – 2030 Development Agenda Items;
- Mr Mekki CHOUIBANI, NEPPO Executive Director, for the CPM Focus Group on Communications.

[10] Ms Natasha LITTLE, FAO Communication Specialist, confirmed her availability to participate to the CPM Focus Group on Communications representing the Office of Communications of the Organization.

[11] CPM FGs Terms of Reference indicate that the first meetings of each CPM Focus Group should occur during the month of July. The IPPC Secretariat proposes the following tentative dates for each CPM Focus Group meeting in the period between 12 and 23 July:

- FG on Implementation of the IPP SF 2020 – 2030 DAI **14 July 2021**
- FG on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues **19 July 2021**
- FG on Communications **23 July 2021**

[12] The IPPC Secretariat informed the CPM Bureau that all endorsed nominees have received notification of their appointment and the period for potential scheduling of the first meetings.

[13] One CPM Bureau member suggested to reschedule the meetings of the CPM FGs on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues. The CPM Bureau discussed the opportunity to reschedule all the meetings to ensure participation and agreed that all CPM Focus Groups may meet at a later stage, to be decided with the IPPC Secretariat through email consultation.

[14] The CPM Bureau:

- (3) *Noted* the endorsed nominations and membership lists for each CPM Focus Group³.
- (4) *Endorsed* the nomination of Mr Pablo CORTESE (Argentina) for the CPM Focus Group on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues.
- (5) *Agreed* to reschedule the CPM Focus Groups first meetings in early September 2021, in consultation with the IPPC Secretariat.

5. Preparation of the Strategic Planning Group Meeting

5.1. SPG provisional Agenda, dates, and venue

[18] The IPPC Secretariat introduced the draft SPG Agenda⁴ for the CPM Bureau's considerations. The CPM Bureau underlined the importance to keep the meeting of the Strategic Planning Group focused on matters that may have a long-term impact on the IPPC work and avoid discussion on procedural matters that may be better addressed by other IPPC governing bodies or the CPM Bureau itself.

[19] The CPM Bureau agreed to discuss the potential draft recommendation from CPM FG on Pest Outbreak Alert and Response System and on the IPPC community involvement in the One Health Approach. The CPM Chairperson, Mr Lucien KONAN KOUAME, volunteered to act as CPM Bureau champion for One Health. The CPM Bureau also added a discussion on the ePhyto solution under the agenda point on CPM Focus Groups.

[20] The CPM Bureau:

(8) *Endorsed* the Provisional Agenda of the Strategic Planning Group 2021, attached to this report as Annex 5.

(9) *Nominated* Mr Lucien KONAN KOUAME as CPM Bureau champion for One Health.

5.2. SPG logistics and communication

[21] The IPPC Secretariat recalled the proposed dates for the SPG 2021 from the previous meeting and the CPM Bureau decided to hold the session on 19 and 21 October 2021, from 10:00 to 12:00 and 14:00, and asked the IPPC Secretariat to send the invitations and publish the SPG 2021 Provisional Agenda on the International Phytosanitary Portal by the end of July.

(10) *Agreed* on the proposed dates and times for the Strategic Planning Group 2021.

(11) *Asked* the IPPC Secretariat to send the invitation and publish the SPG 2021 Provisional Agenda on the International Phytosanitary Portal.

6. Update on the IYPH closing ceremony and next steps on plant health

[23] The IPPC Secretariat introduced the paper 08_Bureau_2021_July on the closing ceremony of the International Year of Plant Health (IYPH) and the proposal by the IYPH International Steering Committee to have the two remaining webinars leading to the International Plant Health Conference (IPHC) on remote sensing in plant health in October, with the support of EPPO and Euphresco, and on the importance of plant health for the UN 2030 Agenda, with the objective to advocate for the inclusion of a plant health-related indicator in the SDGs.

[25] The CPM Bureau shared some comments related to the Terms of Reference for a consultancy position on the diagnostic laboratory network, noting the IPPC Secretariat's comments that this is just a preliminary work to assess the status of existing diagnostic laboratories and to begin to establish a potential framework of reference.

[26] The CPM Bureau welcomed the IPPC Secretariat comments and asked for a discussion paper on this topic to be presented at the CPM Bureau meeting in September.

[27] The CPM Bureau:

- (13) *Asked* the IPPC Secretariat to update the Terms of Reference for the Consultancy post reflecting the comments provided by the CPM Bureau members and draft a discussion paper for the CPM Bureau meeting in September.

8. Banana fusarium TR4 – IC Team

[28] The IPPC Secretariat reported on the need to allocate 20 000 USD to continue supporting the work on the Banana fusarium TR4 – IC Team and the CPM Bureau agreed to said allocation unanimously and requested the IPPC Secretariat to identify the appropriate funding source.

[29] The CPM Bureau:

- (14) *Requested* the IPPC Secretariat to identify the source for funding this work up to 20 000 USD to continue supporting the work on the Banana fusarium TR4 – IC Team.

9. Any Other Business

[30] The CPM Chairperson noted no items under any other business.

10. Next Meeting

[31] The next meeting of the CPM Bureau is scheduled on 26 August 2021, 12:00 – 14:00 (CEST).
