CPM Bureau September 2021

1. Opening of the Meeting

[1] Mr Lucien KONAN KOUAMÉ, Chairperson of the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (CPM), opened the meeting and welcomed all participants. He asked Mr John GREIFER, CPM vice-Chairperson, to facilitate the meeting due to connection instability.

2. Meeting Arrangements

2.1. Documents list

[2] The List of Documents was circulated and is attached to this report as Annex 1.

2.2. Participants list

[3] The List of Participants is attached to this report as Annex 2.

3. Adoption of the Agenda

Mr John GREIFER acknowledged the proposal by Mr Lucien KONAN KOUAMÉ to discuss the IPPC Secretary selection process as well as the request by Mr Peter THOMSON (CPM Bureau representative for South-West Pacific) to add a discussion on the IPPC Phytosanitary Capacity Evaluation (PCE) tool. The IPPC Secretariat informed the CPM Bureau of the draft proposal for IPPC governing body meetings dates for the next biennium, following the FAO calendar. Mr GREIFER also asked for some discussions on the linkages between the IPPC and new FAO Strategic Framework, if time allows. The modified Agenda was adopted and is attached to this report as Annex 3.

4. Update

4.1. CPM Focus Groups: [add titles]

- stage and may not be sufficient to hold a strategical discussion at the Strategic Planning Group (SPG) 2021 in October: 1) Implementation of the IPPC Strategic Framework 2020 2030 2) Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues; and 3) Communications. Updates on the work of these FGs are being prepared to help trigger a strategic discussion during the SPG.
- The IPPC Secretariat reported that the CPM FG on Pest Outbreak Alert and Response Systems has being meeting since January 2021 and is preparing an overview document to present to the SPG to get strategic input on their proposed recommendations to CPM
- Mr Peter THOMSON, CPM Bureau representative on the CPM FG on the *Implementation of the IPPC Strategic Framework (2020 2030) Development Agenda Items* provided an update on their first meeting. The IPPC Secretariat presented the work of the IPPC community on the IPPC Strategic Framework 2020 2030 and summarised the CPM FG's Terms of Reference. Mr THOMSON noted that the next FG meeting is planned for on 22 September 2021 to advance its work, elect a Chairperson, draft an update for the coming meeting of the SPG 2021 and discuss a potential action plan with a timeline indicating milestones and key performance indicators. He reported that the IPPC Secretariat

informed the FG about the interlinkages between the work of this CPM FG and the IPPC work plan in implementing to the IPPC Strategic Framework 2020 - 2030.

- Mr Arop DENG (IPPC Secretariat) reported that the CPM Focus Group on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues held its first meeting, following a similar structure in terms of providing its members orientation and guidance through various presentations and background documents. Ms Maria Lodovica GULLINO, lead author of the Scientific Review of the Impact of Climate Change on Plant Pests, delivered a presentation summarising the key elements of the publication, which was well received by the CPM FG, which agreed to hold three additional meetings before the SPG meeting in October to draft an update and to progress on the action plan.
- Mr Fuxiang WANG (CPM Bureau member for Asia) reported that the CPM FG on Communications met twice already and elected a Chairperson and a Co-Chairperson to reflect the dual nature of the FG: technical expertise in communication and on phytosanitary matters. He informed the CPM Bureau that this FG also received a similar orientation meeting on its Terms of Reference and expected deliveries, noting the active participation of all its members. Mr WANG concluded that this FG is holding a third meeting prior to the SPG meeting in October 2021 to finalise a brief update as requested as well as to advance its work.
- [10] The CPM Bureau:
 - (1) *Noted* the updates.

4.2. Strategic Planning Group 2021

- [11] The IPPC Secretariat confirmed that the meeting of the SPG 2021 is taking place on 19 and 21 October, from 10:00 to 12:00 and 14:00 to 16:00 (Rome time).
- [12] Some Bureau members informed that their regions are preparing discussions papers to the SPG meeting. Mr John GREIFER (SPG Chairperson) asked the IPPC Secretariat to schedule a meeting to plan and assess the adequate time allocation of each agenda item to ensure that all agenda items in the SPG agenda will be discussed in an effective time management. The IPPC Secretariat reminded that there is an ongoing process to revised and merge the IPPC Dispute Settlement Procedures and suggested the CPM Bureau to consider this topic for SPG discussion.
- [13] The CPM Bureau:
 - (2) *Noted* the update.

5. Sixteenth Session of the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures

The IPPC Secretariat updated the CPM Bureau regarding the ongoing preparation of the sixteenth session of the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (CPM-16). The CPM Bureau noted the request to anticipate the decision regarding the CPM-16 modality (virtual, hybrid or in presence) and agreed that travelling is likely to be either restricted or extremely complex for the most part of 2022, also

building on the experience of CPM-15, which was extremely positive. One CPM Bureau member expressed a strong preference towards meetings either in person or hybrid as per each country's regulations, noting that many countries are progressing in vaccinating the population against the SARS-CoV-2. The CPM Bureau concluded that holding CPM-16 virtually would be the preferable option to avoid last-minute changes that may disrupt the IPPC work plan deliverance.

- [15] The CPM Bureau asked the IPPC Secretariat to initiate all the necessary procedures to verify FAO interpreters' availability as well as the latest procedure to hold governing body meetings in a virtual setting. The CPM Bureau agreed to dedicate its November meeting to consolidating the current preliminary draft CPM-16 Provisional Agenda.
- The IPPC Secretariat welcomed the anticipated decision by the CPM Bureau and noted that CPM-15 indicated 4 8 April 2022 as potential dates for CPM-16, which will be checked for FAO interpreters' availability along with additional options, should those dates be taken already.

[17] The CPM Bureau:

- (3) *Decided* to hold the sixteenth session of the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (CPM-16) virtually and *requested* the IPPC Secretariat to begin preparation accordingly.
- (4) Asked the IPPC Secretariat to dedicate the November CPM Bureau meeting to consolidating the preliminary draft CPM-16 Provisional Agenda.

6. Steering Committee of the International Day of Plant Health

- The IPPC Secretariat summarised the evolutions of the International Year of Plant Health (IYPH) Steering Committee (StC), later IYPH Technical Advisory Board (TAB), which ceased to exist once the IYPH International Steering Committee (ISC) was established in 2019. The IPPC Secretariat recalled the CPM-15 decision to function as the IPPC preparatory body for the planning and organization of the First International Plant Health Conference and the webinars leading to it and IYPH ISC decision suggesting to transform the IYPH Technical Advisory Board into the International Steering Committee of the International Day of Plant Health (IDPH ISC) too.
- [19] The CPM Bureau asked the IPPC Secretariat to draft more specific Terms of Reference for the IDPH ISC and submit them to the CPM FG on Communications for its preliminary assessment and evaluation, noting that the current work of the CPM FG on Communications may contribute highly to the planning and deliverance of the IDPH-related activities.
- [20] The CPM Bureau also suggested to consider the Chairperson of the CPM FG on Communications as a member of the IDPH ISC, if appropriate, and concluded that the IDPH work plan should reflect the actual expected engagement by the IPPC community and propose adequate activities.
- [21] The IPPC Secretariat reported that the IYPH action plan included two more webinars of the IYPH series paving the way towards the first International Plant Health Conference: one on remote sensing, in

collaboration with Euphresco, and another on the importance of plant health for the UN 2030 Agenda, with the objective to advocate for the inclusion of a plant health-related indicator in the SDGs. The CPM Bureau requested the IPPC Secretariat to provide additional and in-depth information about the webinars content but noted that that the general topics are timely.

[22] The CPM Bureau:

- (5) *Noted* the update
- (6) Asked the IPPC Secretariat to draft and circulate the Terms of Reference of the International Steering Committee of the International Day of Plant Health (IDPH ISC) with the CPM Focus Group on Communications for commenting.
- (7) Requested the IPPC Secretariat to provide additional and in-depth information about two more webinars of the IYPH series paving the way towards the first International Plant Health Conference: one on remote sensing, in collaboration with Euphresco, and another on the importance of plant health for the UN 2030 Agenda, with the objective to advocate for the inclusion of a plant health-related indicator in the SDGs.

7. EU proposal to move the oversight of Dispute Settlement and Avoidance (DAS) from the Implementation and Capacity Development Committee (IC) to the CPM Bureau

[23] The IPPC Secretariat informed the CPM Bureau about the EU comments on the IC Terms of Reference of the Dispute Settlement and Avoidance (DAS). Ms Marica GATT clarified that this matter is now under the competence of the European Commission (EC), which is discussing this item in the coming week. She informed the CPM Bureau that the EC is drafting a paper for SPG 2021, which will be submitted by the 30 September.

8. Any Other Business:

- Update on the IPPC Secretary selection process
- Mr Lucien KONAN KOUAMÉ expressed his concerns about the delays regarding the slow selection process for the IPPC Secretary, noting that it has been ongoing for over one year. The CPM Chairperson clarified that the final report from the selection panel was submitted in June 2021 and is currently in the hands of the FAO office of human resources. He asked the CPM Bureau to address a letter to the FAO Director-General on behalf of the CPM Bureau to express such concerns highlighting the negative impact on the IPPC community and the IPPC Secretariat. Mr KOUAMÉ will also ask FAO Director-General to expedite the selection process as much as possible. The CPM Bureau agree to send such a letter and underlined the excellent work delivered by Mr Avetik NERSYSIAN, IPPC Secretary Officer-in-Charge, as well as the whole IPPC Secretariat during the past thirteen months.

[25] The CPM Bureau:

(8) Agreed to the CPM Chairperson's initiative to address a letter on its behalf to the FAO Director-General to express their concerns and expedite the selection process.

- Phytosanitary Capacity Evaluation
- [26] Mr Peter THOMSON informed the CPM Bureau that he will be contacting the IPPC Secretariat Implementation and Facilitation Unit to discuss some issues related to the Phytosanitary Capacity Evaluation (PCE) and will report about the outcome at the next CPM Bureau meeting.
 - IPPC governing body meeting over the biennium 2022 2023
- The IPPC Secretariat informed the CPM Bureau that the FAO Conference Services (CS) asked all FAO divisions to consider the scheduling of governing body meetings during the next biennium and presented the dates. The CPM Bureau noted the dates, understanding that the dates would need to be finalized by FAO. The proposed dates are attached to this report as <u>Annex 05</u>.
- [28] The CPM Bureau:
 - (9) *Noted* the update
 - The IPPC and new FAO Strategic Framework
- [29] This item was deferred due to time constraints.

9. Next Meeting

[30] The next meeting of the CPM Bureau is scheduled for 14 October 2021, 12:00 – 14:00 (CEST).

10. Closing of the Meeting

- [31] Mr Brent LARSON (Lead of the Implementation and Facilitation Unit) announced that he began procedures to retire, which may happen in early 2022. The CPM Bureau expressed its gratitude towards Mr LARSON's work for the plant health world and IPPC community, and suggested to seek a way to prolong his stay until CPM-16.
- [32] Mr John GREIFER thanked all participants and adjourned the meeting.
