






2. What is an electronic phytosanitary certificate?

- Electronic equivalent of a paper certificate
- Phyto = electronic phytosanitary certificate
- Requirements of ISPM 12 apply
- May be issued where accepted by the importing country
- Should use standardized language (XML)

Not a scanned certificate



5. Legislative prerequisites for electronic certification

- Phytos are recognized by ISPM 12 as a valid means of exchanging phytosanitary information between exporting and importing countries
- > But national legislation must expressly recognize the validity of ePhytos












7.2 Key figures on the IPPC ePhyto Solution (2/2)



Summary of the certificates successfully exchanged through the HUB

The system is increasingly handling over 180,000 certificates <u>per month</u>, with the capacity to handle (in the current configuration) up to 100,000 certificates <u>per day</u> Data from www.ephytoexchange.org as per June 2023

9. Future development and challenges

- CPM Focus Group on Sustainable Funding for ePhyto
 - Seeking short, medium, and long term funding solutions
- Translation into other languages (GeNS)
 - French and Arabic versions are live, **Spanish soon!**
- Routine maintenance and enhancements
 - Channel enhancements
 - ePayments
- Continued collaboration with non-phytosanitary agencies/organizations (WOAH/Codex/Others)
 - NPPO workshops with the ePhyto Industry Advisory Group (IAG)
 - Ongoing projects with the Global Alliance for Trade Facilitation and World Bank
- Linkage to other government/non-government systems (Single Windows, Customs, ASYCUDA, Blockchains (Covantis, eBills of Lading, etc.))
