1.2 Vision, mission and objectives

- **IPPC Mission:** Protect global plant resources and facilitate safe trade.
- **IPPC Vision:** The spread of plant pests is minimized and their impacts within countries are effectively managed.
- **IPPC objective:** All countries have the capacity to implement harmonized measures to reduce pest spread and minimize the impact of pests on food security, trade, economic growth, and the environment.



1.4 IPPC Governance







- Seven-member executive body of the Commission elected from FAO regions and meets at least four times in a year.
- Role: to provide guidance to the IPPC Secretariat and CPM on strategic direction, cooperation, financial, operational management and provide continuity between CPM sessions, in particular:
- Addressing specific issues assigned to it by the CPM and assisting with the administrative, and operational duties of the CPM in areas such as:
 - Delivery of the IPPC Strategic Framework;
 - Financial planning and management; and
 - Providing advice, guidance and strategic direction to subsidiary and other bodies in between plenary sessions of the CPM, in accordance with CPM decisions.



2.1 Meetings

2.1.1 Governing and subsidiary bodies meetings

- In person CPM-17 was successfully held with over 400 participants from 118 contracting parties, 23 partner organizations and 3 observer countries.
- In person 2022 IPPC Strategic Planning Group (SPG #11) was successfully held last year attended by over 40 participants from 27 CPs, 2 RPPOS and IPPC Secretariat and now preparing for one in October 2023.

- Eleven CPM Bureau meetings including one in person were held in 2022 and two in person meetings in 2023 (March and June 2023) to ensure continuity of IPPC work plan.
- The **Standards Committee (SC)** convened 2 in person meetings in November 2022 and May 2023 inclusive of SC-7 meeting in 2023.
- The Implementation and Capacity Development Committee (IC) met 3 times with one virtual and two in person meetings in November 2022 and May 2023.





2.1.2 Focus Groups and other meetings

- In 2022, 11 meetings of three CPM Focus Groups on Communication, on Climate change and Phytosanitary Issues, and on implementation of the IPPC Strategic Framework 2020 – 2030 development agenda items were successfully held. CPM-17 concluded the work on two of them.
- **3** meetings of FG Climate change and phytosanitary issues as it implements the *IPPC action plan on climate change adopted* by CPM-16.

- Held several meetings with potential partners (donors- 3, African Union and Sub-regions- 5) to socialize the Global Phytosanitary Program (GPP) with special focus on Africa (APP).
- In 2022, the 34th TC-RPPOs convened
 4 successful meetings, and 2 meetings
 (one virtual and one in-person during
 CPM-17 in 2023).



2.2 CPM-17 Decisions (1)

Adoption of:

- IPPC Communication Strategy 2023-2030
- IPPC Partnership Framework
- 5 Standards: amendments to ISPM 5, Annex 2 of ISPM 20, revision of ISPM 18 and PT 45 as Annex 45 to ISPM 28).

Approval of:

• CPM Recommendation on Sea Containers (for consultation period)









2.2 CPM-17 Decisions (2)

IPPC SF 2020-2030 on implementation of DAIs, CPM agreed on

- Establishment of a **new position of programme manager**, to coordinate, monitor, report and mobilize funds for the programme of DAIs;
- Development of IPPC investment prospectus, to be used to raise awareness among contracting parties and relevant international bodies and to support resource mobilization with donor countries and organizations;
- Establishment of focus groups for the DAI on global research coordination and DAI on laboratory diagnostic networking to start scoping and planning for this work; and
- The TC-RPPOs discuss the overarching report on the strategic framework implementation, with the aim of *identifying topics* that the RPPOs could start addressing, within the RPPOs respective mandate, at the regional level;



2.2 CPM-17 Decisions (3)

IPPC SF 2020-2030 DAI on assessment & management of climate change impact on plant health, CPM encouraged

• CPs, NPPOs, RPPOs, stakeholders and all those linked with the IPPC community to participate actively in webinars, workshops and activities related to the impacts of climate change on plant health.











