To address gaps in phytosanitary systems with the development of international standards or implementation resources

To shape the **Standards and Implementation** work of the CPM in alignment with the **Strategic Objectives** outlined in the **IPPC Strategic Framework 2020-2030**

- Adopted ISPMs
- Published guides and training material
- Scientific and technical publications
- Discuss with other NPPOs

### Develop a topic proposal

- Select type of product
- Draft Specification
- Justification
- Scope and Purpose
- Content
- References

# Complete the on-line forms and submit by September 15, 2023

- Submission form
- Draft Specification form (as required depending on type of proposal)
- Official Contact Point submits the online form

#### Seek regional / global support for your topic proposal!

- Discuss with other CPs and RPPOs
- Request that they submit letters supporting your topic proposal



## **Call for Topics process in details**






 Combined 2018 Call for Topics for Standards and Implementation resources was made

#### **CPM-14**

 2021 Call for Topics was refined and streamlined to capitalize on new ideas from the IYPH 2020 activities





# IPPC Standards and Implementation resources development process



Call is made every 2 years

CPs and RPPOs are invited to submit proposals to Secretariat Proposals are reviewed by TFT with SC and IC inputs

TFT prepares final recommendations to CPM for adoption

CPM adopts topics and adds to LOT

Topics go through:
Standards Standards Setting
Process
Implementation
materials - Guides
and training
materials
development
process

Standards are adopted by CPM (DPs by SC) Implementation materials are published



## **Previous Call for topics (2021)**



16 submissions from 8 CPs and 2 RPPOs received, (7 standards, 3 implementation resources, and 6 diagnostic protocols (DPs)) and **10 topics adopted by CPM-16 (2022)** 

#### Challenges

- A lack of global relevance and of clarity on issues
- A lack of **Draft specification** of standards or **Draft Specification** form for proposed IPPC guides and training materials

### Incorrect form filling

- Missing required fields to fill in
- Text change in the form itself

#### Human factor

- Accidental data and formatting damage
- Overlooking the emails associated with the submission

#### Time loss

- To exchange the missing information with CP / RPPO
- To fix the form and its formatting



## **2023 Call for Topics**



### NOTE 1

- 2023 Call for Topics is open 5 May 15 September 2023
- Submissions from previous calls, which weren't added to the work programme, won't be considered unless resubmitted in 2023

### NOTE 2

 Proposals for PTs (as annexes to ISPM 28: PTs for regulated pests) are solicited separately in an ongoing call for treatments





## Key elements of a successful proposal



Phytosanitary problem and solution are clearly identified

Which current issues need a global solution?

What type of solution would best address the issue?

The following materials are considered

Convention text

ISPMs and CPM Recommendations

Strategic Framework 2020–2030

Criteria for the Justification and Prioritization of Proposed Topics

Framework for Standards and Implementation

Procedure manuals

Useful materials for evaluation and future steps are provided

Sufficient background information and references to supporting documentation

Submission is supported by other CPs or RPPOs

Priority will be given to topics with the largest global impact and support letter from CPs and RPPOs are attached to the submission

Draft Specification is well developed

Scope

Purpose

Proposed content

References and supporting materials

A draft Specification is not required for proposals for Diagnostic Protocols



Submissions can be

accepted only from IPPC OCPs / RPPOs

## **Online submission forms**

## **Complete submissions**



## A topic submission is considered complete if

- For proposed standards, <u>both</u> the "Submission form for topics for Standards and Implementation" and the "Draft specification form for proposed standards" are submitted
- For proposed implementation resources, <u>both</u> the "Submission form for topics for Standards and Implementation" and the "Draft specification form for proposed IPPC guides and training materials" are submitted
- For DPs, a "Submission form for DPs for Regulated Pests (Annexes to ISPM 27)" is submitted
