Cooperating with Customs

The e-commerce market moves huge numbers of parcels and small packages across borders, making seamless collaboration between Posts and Customs more necessary than ever. The UPU, through the **Customs Group of the Postal Operations Council**, works actively with partners in the supply chain to keep mail moving across borders and ensure that these mail items reach their destination safely and on time.

One example of such cooperation is with the <u>World Customs Organization</u> (WCO): the **WCO-UPU Contact Committee** was established in 1964 at the Universal Postal Congress in Vienna as a means to collaborate on issues related to the clearance of postal items through customs. This joint committee develops procedures and
