

Why set international standards?











Why set international standards?



All contracting parties operate on a **same level playing field**, facilitating the **safe trade** of plants and plant products.



The aim of international standards is to harmonize phytosanitary measures.



Facilitate safe international trade, protect the environment and ensure food security.

Phytosanitary measures: basic principles



- Only when necessary
- No more restrictive than necessary
- Technical justification
- Minimal impact
- Non-discrimination (→Equivalence of phytosanitary measures)
- Transparency

ISPM1 - Phytosanitary principles for the protection of plants and the application of phytosanitary measures in international trade (adopted in 1993, revised in 2006)

The Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (CPM) adopts ISPMs









Manages the development of ISPMs



Provides guidance and oversight to the work of Expert Drafting Groups





CPs and RPPOs Submit topics

SC

Reviews topics submitted Recommend priorities and submit to CPM

CPM

Reviews, changes and adopts List of topics (LOT) for IPPC standards

(Stage 1)

Call for topics: every 2 years

To submit the topics for ISPMs

- **✓** Draft specification
- ✓ Literature review
 - **✓** Justification

SC and CPM review LOT annually



Drafting standards

(Stage 2)

Development of a specification



Assigns a lead Steward and assistant(s) for each topic

Reviews draft Specification

Approves draft Specification for consultation period



Makes draft Specification publicly available

Solicits comments through Online Comment System (OCS) 90 days
Comments received: compiles → makes publicly available → submits to
Steward and to SC for consideration



Revises and approves Specification* (exception see CPM-19 agenda item 13.1: "Safe humanitarian aid")



Makes Specification publicly available

Drafting standards

(Stage 2)

Preparation of a draft ISPM

IPPC Secretariat

Expert
Drafting
Group (EDG)
(EWG or TP)

Issues call for experts – Nominations for EWG or TP members from NPPOs and RPPOs

Drafts or revises draft ISPM in accordance with Specification

Reviews draft ISPM at the meetings (for DP or PT, electronically)

Decides:

- to approve the ISPM for consultation
- to return it to Steward or EDG or
- to put it on hold



Consultation and review

(Stage 3)

First/Second consultation - 90 days



Steward



SC-7



IPPC Secretariat Draft ISPM approved by SC for 1st consultation → makes publicly available

Solicits comments through the Online Comment System (OCS)

Compiles comments and makes publicly available → submits to Steward for consideration

Reviews and prepares responses to comments + revises draft ISPM \rightarrow submits to IPPC Secretariat

Records responses to major issues in SC-7 meeting report

Approves draft ISPM for 2nd consultation

Draft ISPM approved by SC for 2nd consultation → makes publicly available

Adopting and publication draft I

(Stage 4)

SC

recommends
draft ISPM to CPM
for adoption

Draft ISPM posted on webpage of CPM session

If CP does not support adoption of draft ISPM → OBJECTION (up to 3 weeks before CPM session)



✓ Technical justification

✓ Suggestions for improvement

If no objection, CPM adopts ISPMs without discussion

Adopting and publication

(Stage 4)



Adopted ISPM, PT or DP is made publicly available

Publication of an ISPM

CPs and **RPPOs** may form a **Language Review Group (LRG)** → proposes adjustments*

to translations of adopted ISPMs

*These adjustments are noted at next CPM session



SC to CPM-19: Recommending <u>two</u> ISPMs for adoption

(Agenda Item 10)

- Draft annex International movement of fresh *Mangifera indica* fruit (2021-011) to ISPM 46 (Commodity-specific standards for phytosanitary measures)
- Draft annex Use of systems approaches in managing the pest risk associated with the movement of wood (2015-004) to ISPM 39 (International movement of wood)

IPPC Standard Setting Process main steps and calendar

Submitting topics	Call for topics (every 2 years) *SC and CPM	Next call in 2025: May to August
Submitting phytosanitary treatments	Open call	On going call (via IPP)
SC nominations	1 time per year	CPM sessions - Letter for nominations
Experts' nominations	Throughout the year	Call for experts: EWGs, Technical Panels, DP drafting groups (authors)
SC meetings	3 times per year	SC May, SC-7 (May) and SC November
Consultation period for draft Specifications and ISPMs (via OCS)	1 time per year (90 days)*	01 July – 30 September
	*For draft DPs: 2 times per year	*For draft DPs: 30 January – 03 May
Consultation period for CPM Recommendations (via OCS)	1 time per year (90 days)	01 July – 30 September
Expert consultation on draft DPs	Throughout the year (at least 30 days)	(via IPP)
DP Notification period (adoption process for draft DPs) (via IPP)	2 times per year (45 days)	01 July – 15 August 31 January – 15 March
Adoption of ISPMs	1 time per year	CPM sessions
