#### 1. Opening of the meeting

#### 1.1 Welcome by the IPPC Secretariat

The virtual meeting of the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (CPM) Focus Group on Climate Change and Phytosanitary Issues (FG-CCPI) was convened by the IPPC Secretariat (hereafter referred to as "the secretariat"). The Chair opened the meeting with an apology for cancelling the April 2025 meeting due to a scheduling conflict. He also welcomed Russell Caplen, who introduced himself as interim support from IPPC. Mr. Caplen has been with IPPC since January 2025.

#### 2. Meeting arrangements

#### 2.1 Election of the rapporteur

[2] Karen CASTRO, Focus Group member from North America, volunteered as rapporteur for the month's meeting report.

#### 2.2 Adoption of the agenda

The focus group adopted the agenda (Appendix 1) with the following agenda items added: financial status of the group; update on the paper to be presented to the CPM Bureau meeting in June; updates on the Chair's presentation to the Implementation and Capacity Development Committee held in June; and schedule of future meetings.

#### 3. Administrative matters

[4] The participant list is presented as Appendix 2 to this report.

#### 4. Review of Outstanding Action Items

- The secretariat had previously agreed to follow-up on organizing an initial meeting with FAO Partnerships and UN Collaboration Division (PSU) and the Focus Group Member from FAO Office or Climate Change, Biodiversity and Environment (OCB) for exploring synergies and collaborative opportunities. The secretariat confirmed the action was pending coordination between them and FAO OCB.
- [6] The focus group decided to forego pursuing the topic on PRA legal aspects as the two relevant ISPMs are currently being revised.

#### 5. Planning for Upcoming Webinars (October 2025)

- [7] Discussion on identifying and confirming speakers:
  - The member from Latin America to explore options from the citrus greening group.
  - The member from NENA to follow up with an expert from the University of California at Davis (UC-Davis).
  - The Chair to confirm with a potential speaker from the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA).
  - The focus group discussed balancing speakers based on gender and region.

- [8] Discussion about potential time zone and scheduling:
  - Tentative dates: 1st and 2nd October 2025.
  - Proposed time: 2:00 PM Rome Time (considered suitable for most locations).
- [9] The member from Latin America agreed to send suggested speaker name(s) for citrus greening by 10 June 2025. It was pointed out that not all experts who work on citrus greening also focus on climate change. Therefore, careful selection is required.
- [10] Focus group members nominated the NENA member as facilitator for the webinar on 1 October 2025 and agreed that the facilitator for the webinar on 2 October 2025 would be decided in the next meeting when all focus group members will be present.

#### 6. FG-CCPI Report for June 2025 Bureau Meeting

[11] Focus group members reviewed the draft FG-CCPI report for the June 2025 CPM Bureau meeting and provided feedback on the draft report in advance of the 30 May 2025 deadline.

#### 7. Fact Sheet Development

- [12] The member from Asia noted that fact sheet templates may vary due to country-specific requirements and emphasized the need for format harmonization while maintaining some flexibility across countries. The Secretariat agreed format harmonization was needed and emphasized that drafts should be reviewed internally before further steps.
- [13] The member from North America asked for clarification on use of the Fall Armyworm (FAW) fact sheet (developed by the member from Europe) as a template for the remaining fact sheets. The Chair confirmed that the FAW fact sheet format is suitable as a standard for this focus group.
- [14] Members confirmed ongoing work on their respective fact sheets.

#### 8. Transition and Farewell

[15] Mutya Frio expressed appreciation for the team's collaboration and explained the need for focal point transition due to her workload and limited availability. She shared her pleasure in working with the team and invited members visiting Rome to connect for coffee or lunch and formally recommended that Russell Caplen assume responsibilities as the focus group's interim focal point in the IPPC Secretariat's office.

#### 9. Next Steps and Closing of the Meeting

- [16] After group discussion, the Chair confirmed the next Focus Group meeting would be held on Wednesday, 2 July 2025 from 17:00 to 19:00 CET (Rome time) and that succeeding meetings are scheduled on Tuesday, 5 August 2025 and Tuesday, 9 September 2025.
- [17] The Secretariat noted that participants did not have time to discuss the financial status of the focus group as requested when the agenda was adopted at the beginning of the meeting. Therefore, a brief update on the budget will be added to the 2 July 2025 meeting agenda.
- [18] The focus group noted the following outstanding action items:
  - 1) *organize* an initial meeting with FAO PSU to determine potential synergies and opportunities for collaboration and support as related to action plan item 4.5 (to be actioned by the FAO OCB focus group member and secretariat interim focal point);
  - 2) *reach out* to the expert from UC-Davis (to be actioned by the focus group member from the NENA region);

- 3) *reach out* to potential speakers on citrus greening (to be actioned by the focus group member from the Latin America region);
- 4) reach out to potential speaker from EFSA (to be actioned by the Chair);
- 5) confirm speaker from CGIAR/CIAT (to be actioned by the focus group member from FAO OCB);
- 6) confirm speaker from CABI (to be actioned by the focus group member from Africa);
- 7) review draft fact sheets internally (to be actioned by all focus group members); and
- 8) standardize template structure for all fact sheets (to be actioned by all focus group members.
- [19] The Chair thanked the participants for their contributions and closed the meeting.
