## Australia and New Zealand Systems

- Australia and New Zealand have a similar history of import controls, and attempt to achieve a high ALOP
- Import systems are similar though differences in domestic legislation affect some aspects
- Currently attempting to ensure WPM manufacturing systems are compatible to enhance bi-lateral trade. Systems are based on the regulatory model.



## ISPM 15 Import Clearance Systems

- New Zealand & Australia have a long history of regulating the import of SWP. SWP was subject to inspection unless (for Australia only) treated by an approved method off shore
  - SWP was inspected for pests (e.g. insects, fungi), soil, and bark
  - As a consequence of this intervention, Australia & New Zealand are free of many of the timber pests associated with SWP
  - Australia and New Zealand have also been able to compile an extensive interception record for SWP, which includes many non-timber or hitchhiker pests.

## ISPM 15 Import Clearance Systems

- New Zealand began recognizing ISPM15 compliant SWP in April 2003 (along with existing requirements), subject to inspection for bark, soil, and hitchhiker pests
  - Australia implemented new import conditions on 1 September 2004 that recognize ISPM 15 compliant SWP, including its long-standing requirement that packaging be free of bark (pending further investigation and international review)
  - To date both countries have maintained their existing import options, ensuring continued market access for countries not in position to implement ISPM 15.

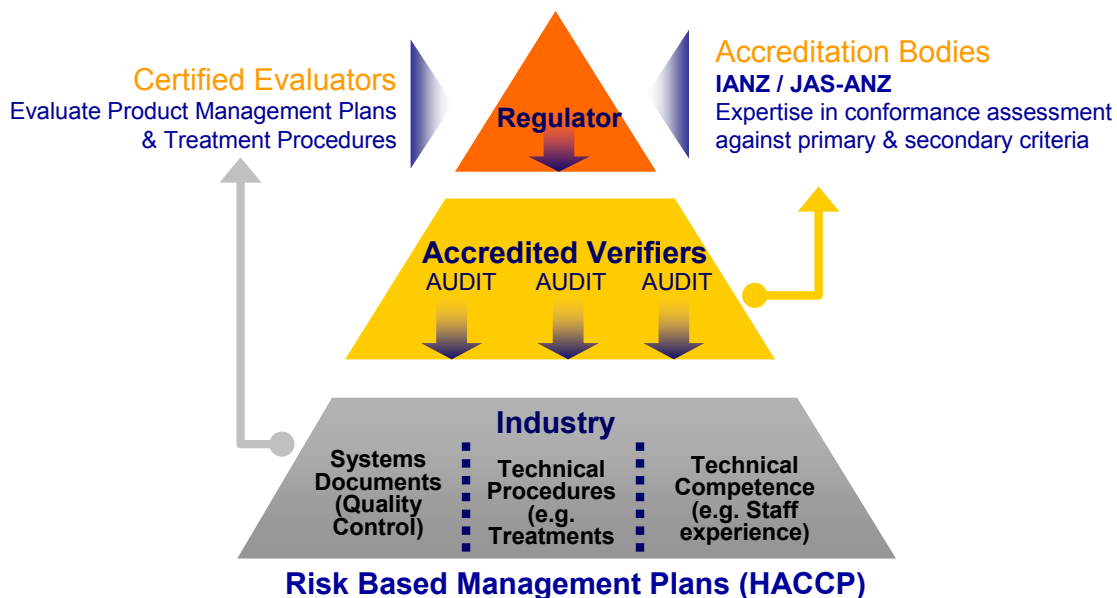


# ISPM 15 Import Clearance Systems

- Break Bulk WPM and Dunnage inspected on arrival at ports
- Containers require a declaration and/or certificate providing the status of WPM within (e.g. no solid wood, ISPM 15 compliant etc) – failure to declare compliant WPM will result in on-arrival inspection at port
- Compliance allows containers to be inspected at point of unloading (e.g. importers premises) – Inspections overseen by NPPO (NZMAF or AQIS).

# ISPM 15 WPM Manufacture



**AQIS-NZMAF (NPPO):** Provide technical standards for performance requirements and regulation of verification agencies and manufactures, and have oversight for system performance, and accredit verification agencies



**Accredited Verifiers (or IVAs)** audit and approve (certify) manufacturers to NPPO standards



**Manufacturers** produce ISPM 15 compliant WPM in accordance with approved processes and procedures.



# ISPM 15 WPM Manufacture

- **WWW** register of approved (certified) manufacturers, FAQs, hotline, key information and contacts
- Imported ISPM 15 treated timber (unstamped) can be used if assurance equivalent to domestic supply (e.g. equivalent systems in country of origin, phytosanitary certificate)
- **AQIS only** – offshore accreditation to AQIS fumigation standards (AFAS) to ensure compliant systems.
