I. Technical assistance activities by region (2001 - 2005)

1. "With the purpose of securing common and effective action to prevent the spread and introduction of pests of plants and plant products, and to promote appropriate measures for their control, the contracting parties undertake to adopt the legislative, technical and administrative measures specified in this convention ... " (Article 1 of the IPPC).

2. The IPPC Secretariat continues to play a significant role in helping countries to make the necessary adjustments described above. Over the last five years, capacity building programmes have focused on requirements for implementation of the IPPC, International Standards for Phytosanitary Measures (ISPMs) and the SPS Agreement. Countries are assisted through advisory technical services, which focus on promoting adequate phytosanitary systems for the implementation of ISPMs by addressing issues which impede implementation, and promoting market access. Among the critical areas being addressed are the modernization of legal frameworks, institutional strengthening, training in relation to ISPMs, pest surveillance to provide the basis for conducting pest risk analysis (PRA), skills training in conducting PRAs, information systems for decision making, documented procedures and laboratory facilities. In many cases, requests for assistance relate to the strengthening of national capabilities and systems for containment of newly introduced pest species, and the establishment of pest free areas in relation to a specific target pests.

3. In the last five years, the IPPC Secretariat has managed the delivery of technical assistance to developing countries of about 20 million USD from FAO-Technical Cooperation Programme funding and about 2 million USD from trust funds, direct assistance from Secretariat and other donor contributions. Furthermore, the development and application of the Phytosanitary Capacity Evaluation (PCE) tool has contributed significantly in raising national awareness of the

needs of NPPOs, contributing to national strategic plans, providing a basis for formulating unilateral trust fund and other donor funded projects and giving guidance to the delivery of technical assistance to developing countries.
