Proposed Updates of the Strategic Plan in Relation to Technical Assistance

Agenda Item 12.6.2 of the Provisional Agenda

- 1. A meeting of an Informal Working Group on Technical Assistance (IWG-TA) took place in Rome in March 2005. The purpose of the IWG-TA was to discuss technical assistance issues, specifically regarding the implementation of the IPPC and the International Standards for Phytosanitary Measures (ISPMs), and to identify strategies to promote the implementation of standards.
- 2. The informal working group analyzed the results of the application of the Phytosanitary Capacity Evaluation (PCE) tool in more than 60 countries, which identified major constraints in many developing countries. In particular, lack of an appropriate legislative framework, institutional weaknesses, and inappropriate management structures and skills have been identified as high priority areas of need. In addition, the application of the PCE tool shows that the lack of awareness on the part of policy-makers and the private sector is a major impediment for transforming NPPOs into effective organisations able to comply with the obligations of the IPPC/ISPMs.
- 3. In order to tailor the technical assistance activities of the ICPM/CPM to the needs identified through the PCE, it was thought that the strategic directions of the ICPM/CPM Strategic Plan should be reviewed. Within this context, Strategic Direction No. 4: *The development of the phytosanitary capacity of members by promoting the provision of technical assistance* was discussed and amendments proposed.
- 4. In addition, an Informal Working Group on Phytosanitary Capacity Evaluation had also met in March 2005 and had made recommendations specifically in relation to the PCE tool.
- 5. At its seventh meeting in October 2005, the Informal Working Group on Strategic Planning and Technical Assistance (SPTA) reviewed the results and recommendations of the

IWG-TA and the IWG-PCE. The SPTA considered that the recommendations of the IWG-TA were very extensive. It felt that the time allocated to discuss these subjects in the meeting of the SPTA did not reflect the importance of the subjects. For this reason the SPTA believed that the proposals of the IWG-TA should be presented to CPM-1 and advice be sought from the CPM on how to proceed with the recommendations. Regarding the recommendations of the IWG-PCE, the SPTA proposed that the high priority recommendations be incorporated into the Strategic Plan (they are part of CPM 2006/15).

- 6. The recommendations from the IWG-PCE and IWG-TA regarding proposed changes to Strategic Direction No. 4 of the Strategic Plan (CPM 2006/15) are presented in Annex 1.
- 7. The CPM is invited to:
 - 1. *Consider* the recommendations of the IWG-TA and the IWG-PCE to change Strategic Direction No. 4 of the Strategic Plan (Annex 1).
 - 2. Advise on how to proceed in this matter.
 - 3. *Envisage* that the IWG-TA, already mentioned in the Strategic Plan (CPM 2006/15), continue to provide guidance in relation to technical assistance.
