



Predictability of operations and risk mitigation



IMPACTS OBSERVED ON AGRI-TRADE OPERATIONS FOLLOWING EPHYTO IMPLEMENTATION

Safety

Traceability and trusted information
Reduced risks of errors due to Human intervention

Speed

Faster/Simpler administrative processes for the request and obtaining of PCs

• Streamlined information exchange between control authorities and traders

Visibility

• Real time information on the process for NPPOs and traders, on both import and export sides

Strategic trade data and analysis possibilities for NPPOs and Ministries of Agriculture

Predictability

• Enhanced operational predictability for public and private actors (e.g. Inspection resources scheduling and management, planning of transport and logistics operations, ...)

Reactivity

 Enhanced reaction capacity to tackle errors and unexpected modifications of shipments' information (Case of Replacement Certificates)

Minimizing the

exposure to Risk and Uncertainty

Enhanced planning & execution of trade and transit operations, resulting in:

- Reliable trade → Enhanced export service quality & Client satisfaction
- Less cost & delays → Reduction of Losses (e.g.: Products shelf live, spoilage, demurrage...)
- Streamlined processes → Better opportunities for SMEs
- Traceable operations → Enhanced trust between public and private actors
- Optimized public resources → Cost effective services and governance of Control operations
