- Available in English, French and Spanish!

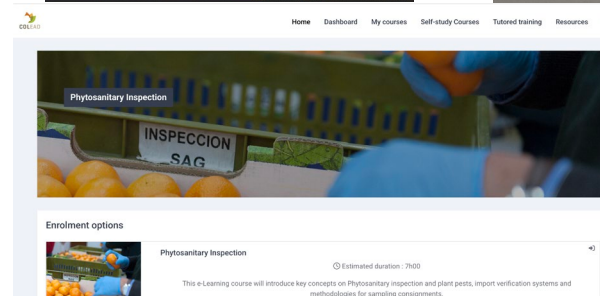
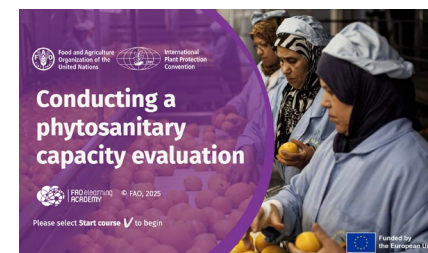


Designed to Support Both Self-Paced Learning and Structured Training Programmes

Incorporate high-quality IPPC content into plant health and phytosanitary curricula.



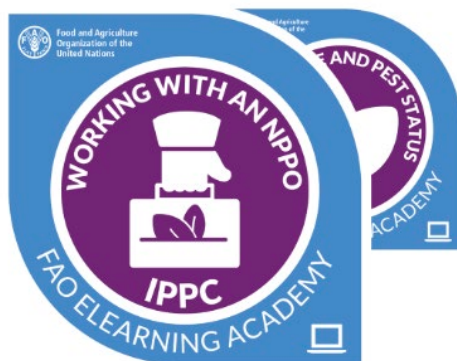

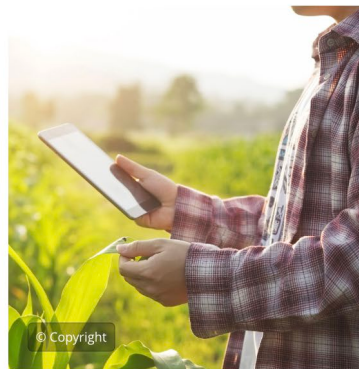

Welcome to the IPPC Plant Health Campus.

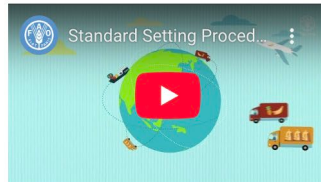
The IPPC Plant Health Campus is your portal to e-learning courses, guides and technical information focused on key phytosanitary systems.

NPPOs

- 1
 - Bilateral discussions to identify national capacity development priorities
 - Selection of courses according to staff roles and level of expertise
 - Introductory courses for new staff and technical courses for experienced officers
 - Integration into onboarding programmes, continuous professional development and national training plans
 - Ongoing support from the FAO elearning Academy (**Costanza.Mattia@fao.org**)

Universities

- 2
 - Contact the FAO elearning Academy (**Costanza.Mattia@fao.org**)
 - Introductory meeting to understand programmes and learning objectives
 - Joint identification of the most relevant Plant Health Campus courses
 - Support to integrate courses into existing curricula, learning pathways or blended learning
 - Guidance, promotional materials, webinars and ongoing technical support

Our approach is demand-driven. We work with each institution to identify the most appropriate learning solutions based on their specific needs.
