## 1. Opening of the Meeting

- [1] Mr Ralf LOPIAN, Chairperson of the IYPH International Steering Committee (IYPH ISC), opened the meeting noting the presence of the IYPH Advocates Mr Monty DON, Mr Diarmuid GAVIN and Mr Rodrigo PACHECO<sup>1</sup>, inviting them to share any remarks, thoughts and views on their role as IYPH Advocates.
- [2] Mr Rodrigo PACHECO (IYPH Ambassador for Latin America and Caribbean) thanked the IYPH ISC and FAO for this opportunity to promote plant health as he considers actions the most effective way to communicate the IYPH key messages. Mr PACHECO presented some of the initiatives he has been working on in his country to promote responsible production and consumption, sustainable agriculture of local crops to support biodiversity and combat the negative effect of climate change. He mentioned his project to create the largest edible forest in the world, amongst others, to showcase what he has been and would continue doing to protect plants. He thanked the IYPH ISC, FAO and the IPPC community for their trust and confirmed his availability to participate to any relevant events in the region as well as coming to Finland for the International Plant Health Conference (IPHC) from 28 June to 1 July.
- [3] Mr Monty DON (IYPH Ambassador for Europe) thanked the IYPH ISC, FAO and the IPPC community for the opportunity to promote plant health, underlining the difficulties in convey the messages to the general public as plant health is often perceived as a very technical matter. Mr DON focused on the important relationships between plants and their surroundings, such as soil and the environment in general, and that plant health interlinks with human health, especially mental wellbeing. He concluded that his efforts in communicating the IYPH key messages would also like to support a better definition of plant health for the general public, trying to find one that approaches the matter more holistically and beyond the anthropocentric view.
- [4] Mr Diarmuid GAVIN (IYPH Champion) also expressed his gratitude for his selection and appointment as one of the IYPH Advocates, agreeing that plant health requires a more holistic approach as well as definition. He noted the importance of promoting positive communication towards plant health, particularly in terms of education. He recalled he was taught to rely and apply products to keep plants healthy while he noted that the methodology has been evolving throughout the years with approaches that are more friendly to the environment and thus sustainable, which is the message that he would keep spreading. Mr GAVIN also highlighted the social and cultural aspect of plants and recalled the Irish experience of the Potato Famine and the case of *Xylella f.* in Italy, noting how the impact of pests scarred the communities also socially and culturally. He expressed his availability to join forces with the other IYPH Advocates in promoting plant health in a holistic manner, stressing the importance of several factors such as soil and pollinators, amongst others, to keep plants health.
- [5] The IYPH ISC thanked the IYPH Advocates and welcomed their enthusiasm and availability to play an active role in promoting plant health. Several IYPH ISC members suggested the importance of sharing personal experiences when communicating the importance of plant health as well as making the linkages between plant health and human health very clear, particularly human mental wellbeing. The IYPH ISC also noted the importance of highlighting the cultural and social impacts of plants, especially when threatened or referring to the current COVID-19 pandemic, which brought up the importance of plants in our surroundings.
- [6] The IYPH ISC suggested the IYPH Advocates to acquire more information about the plant health community and its activities, particularly the IPPC work in prevention through the application of standards, noting the valuable contribution to the international community while supporting the message that plants are important for the world's societies and culture, which should be widely communicated as well as the fact that healthy-looking plants may still be vectors for plants pests and diseases. The importance of establishing multi-stakeholder partnerships was highly underlined.

[7] The IYPH ISC:

- (1) *Thanked* the IYPH Advocates for accepting their roles, noting with satisfaction the alignment of their ideas for communicating the importance of plant health and the IYPH key messages;
- (2) *Invited* the IYPH Advocates to participate to the coming meetings of the IYPH ISC to provide updates and additional contribution to the discussions as well as to participate to the first International Plant Health Conference in Helsinki from 28 June to 1 July 2021.

## 4. Background and Reports

[10] The IYPH Secretariat reported that all actions emerging from the previous IYPH ISC meeting were fully carried out.

## 5. IYPH Legacy

### 5.1 International Day of Plant Health

[11] The IYPH Secretariat reported that the FAO Council, recalling the criteria outlines in the FAO Policy on the Proclamation and Implementation of International Years, as adopted by the 144th Session of the Council (June 2012), and the ECOSOC Resolution 1980/67 regarding International Years and Anniversaries, endorsed the draft Conference resolution submitted by the 27th Session of COAG on the observance by the UN system of an “International Day of Plant Health” on 12 May every year. Explicit support to the initiative came from several FAO Members, from all FAO Regions. These include Indonesia on behalf of G-77 and China (further supported by interventions of Dominican Republic, Argentina, Brazil and Peru); Thailand on behalf of the Asia Regional Group (further supported by Japan, Republic of Korea and China); Germany on behalf of the EU and its 27 Member States (further supported by Spain); Iran on behalf of the Near East regional group (further supported by Saudi Arabia); Sweden on behalf of the Nordic countries; Zimbabwe and Uganda on behalf of the Africa regional group (further supported by Ghana); Australia; Canada; Mexico; United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland; and United States of America.

[12] The FAO Council further recognised the importance of raising awareness on plant health as a key tool to safeguard food security, and to contribute to the SDGs, emphasising the need for greater support be provided to the IPPC Secretariat.

[13] The IYPH ISC:

- (3) *Noted with appreciation* the recognition by the FAO Council to the importance of raising awareness on plant health as a key tool to safeguard food security, and to contribute to the Sustainable Development Goals.
- (4) *thanked* Zambia for the support as well as all countries and organizations supporting the establishment of an International Day of Plant Health.

### 5.2 Youth Declaration on Plant Health

[14] The IYPH Secretariat informed the IYPH ISC that a call to gather expressions of interest for drafting the Youth Declaration has been posted on the IYPH website, clarifying that this is an initiative falling under the IYPH legacies. The IYPH Secretariat clarified that the drafting youth group may hold its first meeting during January, following the closure of the call on 22 December, underlining that the youth ownership is





a key element of this declaration that should be maintained. The IYPH Secretariat also informed that other youth groups that have plant-health-related missions, such as boy- and girl scout associations, have been contacted but have not replied yet.

## 6. IYPH Budget and Resource Mobilisation

- [15] The IYPH Secretariat updated the IYPH ISC on the latest modifications to the IYPH budget, confirming reception of USD 100 000 from Ireland and the confirmation of the pledge of USD 50 000 from the Republic of Korea. The IYPH Secretariat clarified that pledged contributions are currently listed in the paper on the IYPH Budget and Resource Mobilisation. The IYPH Secretariat noted that the current gap to implement all the items in the work plan sums up to USD 27 000 and there is a highlight of how much is allocated to staff and operations as well as currently available cash.
- [16] The IYPH ISC Chairperson suggested to consider allocating any potential leftovers of the budget to be reallocated towards the first International Day of Plant Health.
- [17] The IYPH ISC:
- (5) *Noted* the update regarding the IYPH budget and resource mobilisation.
  - (6) *Thanked* the Republic of Ireland and the Republic of Korea for their contributions.
  - (7) *Agreed* to consider allocating any potential leftovers of the budget to be reallocated towards other relevant activities such as the ones for the first International Day of Plant Health.

## 7. IYPH Communication

The update on this item was provided in a written form, which is attached to the report as [Annex 4](#).

## 8. IYPH Action Plan

### 8.1 Planning for the International Plant Health Conference and IYPH Closing Ceremony and update on possible listing as Preparatory Meeting of the UN Food Systems Summit

- [18] Mr Ralf LOPIAN (IYPH ISC Chairperson) informed the IYPH ISC that he has been visiting the conference facilities to clarify whether a physical meeting is feasible following the necessary safety protocols of physical distancing. He informed the IYPH ISC that the conference hall may accommodate a maximum three hundred participants, respecting the safety protocols currently in place in Finland.
- [19] Ms Aulikki HULMI (Finland) updated the IYPH ISC on the advancements to listing the IPHC amongst the preparatory meetings to the UN Food System Summit, which Finland is currently requesting through its Minister of Agriculture and Forestry.
- [20] The IYPH Secretariat informed the IYPH ISC that they have been in touch with the technical lead in FAO for the UN Food System Summit and he suggested that there could be the possibility to organise an independent dialogue as an open-related initiative in preparation of the UN Food System Summit.
- [21] The IYPH ISC Chairperson suggested to seek clarity on the feasibility on organising such independent dialogues to promote plant health and its contributions to food security and safety.
- [22] Ms Elsa SIMOES (Cabo Verde) suggested the proposal of a side event to the next session of the Committee on World Food Security, noting that the applications opened already. IYPH ISC Chairperson agreed to the idea and asked in particular for support from Rome-based IYPH ISC members.
- [23] The IYPH ISC:
- (8) *Asked* the IYPH Secretariat to seek further information about organising an independent dialogue as an additional activity in preparation of the UN Food System Summit, finalise the draft proposal for a CFS side event in consultation with the IYPH ISC Chairperson and FAO Permanent Representatives sitting in the IYPH ISC.





## 8.2 Progress with Study on Impact of Climate Change on Plant Health

- [24] The IYPH Secretariat informed that the study report will be presented at the high-level event scheduled on 1 June 2021, as mentioned in the paper, to which the FAO DG is being invited to deliver the opening remarks, the lead author will also outline the focus of the study, also the representatives from the drafting committee will be delivering speeches, as well as other relevant international organizations and FAO relevant divisions. The IYPH Secretariat clarified that the event is going to take place completely online and that several institutional communications are being scheduled to promote the initiative.
- [25] Ms Aulikki HULMI (Finland) suggested to invite the Finnish Permanent Secretary for Agriculture and Forestry to the event. Several communication initiatives to promote the event and the study. The event will be streamed and fully virtual.
- [26] Ms Elsa SIMOES (Cabo Verde) supported the involvement of politics at the decision level as one of the products will be policy guidance.
- [27] The IYPH ISC Chairperson welcomed the update, noting that the proposed activities are extremely positive, and encouraged the IYPH Secretariat to consider the inclusion of more high-level political participations.
- [28] The IYPH ISC:
- (9) *Asked* the IYPH Secretariat to extend an invitation to the Permanent Secretary for Agriculture and Forestry of Finland for the study presentation event and consider inviting other relevant high-level political figures as appropriate.

## 8.3 Proposals for IYPH events/initiatives in 2021

This item was discussed jointly with the following one.

## 8.4 Proposal for Art Event linked to Plant Health in 2021

- [29] The IYPH Secretariat introduced the proposal to entertain a photo exhibition titled “A Portrait of a Tree” by Mr Adrian Houston during the International Plant Health Conference, also accessible virtually through a dedicated website, and discussed the possibility to further build on the linkages between plant health and art by proposing a creative reflection on the IYPH slogan, particularly in view of the establishment of an International Day of Plant Health on which such artistic initiatives may be hosted.
- [30] The IYPH ISC welcomed the initiative linking plant health to art as well as the photo exhibition, and asked the IYPH Secretariat to gather additional information, especially in terms of budget, for holding the photo exhibition virtually and in presence at the IPHC.
- [31] The IYPH ISC:
- (10) *Asked* the IYPH Secretariat to seek additional information on the photo exhibition titled “A Portrait of a Tree” by Mr Adrian Houston in view of holding it at the International Plant Health Conference in Helsinki.
- (11) *Welcomed* the suggestion to further build on the linkages between plant health and art, asking IYPH Secretariat to elaborate a more detailed proposal also in view of the first potential International Day of Plant Health.

## 9. Any Other Business

- [32] The IYPH ISC Chairperson did not note any discussion under this item.

## 10. Next Meeting

- [33] A survey will be circulated to establish the next IYPH ISC meeting during the last week of January 2021.





## 11. Close of the Meeting

[34] The IYPH ISC Chairperson thanked all the participants and wished everyone merry seasonal holidays.
